



Photography Consent for Under 18's

During the course of training or during events, the club may take photographs/videos to use as part of technique analysis or for use on the club's website or social media channels.

In line with British Triathlon's Safeguarding Policy we aware that there maybe instances where parents/children would not consent to images being used. In line British Triathlon's Safeguarding Policy the following code is observed by Cadence Tri.

- If imagery of an athlete under 18 years of age is published or used by the club for any reason the athlete's parents/carers should have given consent.
- An athlete's parents/carers should have the opportunity to refuse their child being photographed. This should not exclude the child from any club activities*.

The following consent form is referred to within the tick box of the membership application.

Cadence Tri recognises the need to ensure the welfare and safety of all young people in triathlon. As part of our commitment to ensure this safety we will not permit photographs or recorded images of young people to be taken or used without the consent of the parent/guardian/young person.

Cadence Tri will follow the guidance for the use of images of young people as detailed in the British Triathlon Federation Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy and take steps to ensure images are used solely for the purposes they are intended, which is for the promotion and celebration of multi-sport activities.

If you become aware that these images are being used inappropriately you should inform the Home Nation Lead Safeguarding Officer and/or the Club Welfare Officer
